Our children are off to a great start with school. Each child has wonderful stories to share during our gathering time during Sunday school. The joy and delight in their voices help renew my spirit as we spend time together learning Sharable Parables. Thank you for sharing your children with me each week!

September 25th will be our "official" beginning of the new children's ministry activities. The Celebration Singers Choir begins the 25th from 4:30 – 5:00 pm with Lindsay Morgan. We encourage and invite all children 3 years old through 5th grade to join us in the Sanctuary to praise God through movement and songs.
