This past Sunday we began Holy Week - the journey to the cross.

As our children came down the aisle waving their palm branches during worship, we were reminded of Jesus' joyful entry into Jerusalem. Maundy Thursday, also known as "Holy Thursday," commemorates the sharing of the Last Supper with Jesus and the Apostles. We will re-enact this meal on Thursday April 13th, at 6:30 pm with the service of Holy Communion. **Good Friday** is a religious holiday that commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus Christ and his death at Calvary. We observe this day during Holy Week on the Friday preceding Easter Sunday. You may also have heard the name Good

Friday by the names of "Holy Friday", "Great Friday", "Black Friday", or "Easter Friday." Our Good Friday service will take place at **6:30 pm on April 14th** in the Sanctuary. Directly after that service, we will walk the cross to the outside church yard.

Our journey has begun. Let us make our way to cross together. - Pastor Cindy




