Sometimes when you are watching TV or reading a book or otherwise engaged... something happens that grabs your attention. You see something that strikes you - and you stop what you are doing, and focus your attention and take note. I want to share with one such "attention grabber" - at least it was for me - and I think it may be for you as well.

Just last week, an article in the newspaper caught my attention. Above it was a picture of a young man sitting on the steps outside a school. He was bald, and all around him were his classmates, about 25 of them. Some were wearing school jackets, others were in T-Shirts and regular jackets and their heads were bowed toward the camera - and they, too, were bald.

The headline read: "TRUE BLUE PALS" and the caption said: "Mark Busse, 16, of Reardon, Washington, poses with classmates from his high school in this eastern Washington state town. His friends shaved their heads to show support for Busse

after his hair fell out following chemotherapy for inoperable lung cancer. His buddies said that they didn't want him to stand out in the 180 student high school."

This article touched my heart when I first saw it. And it still does.

The thought of his friends support in this way was so precious and showed so much love. It struck me that this is so much like what Jesus commanded his disciples to baptize all nations in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. He asked John to baptize him - even though - as scripture states - there was no need for it.

In this newspaper article, there was no need - either - for Mark Busses friends and class mates to shave their heads. But they did.

Baptism: Making Love Real

God has done in Christ. At Christmas we celebrate that God came among us so we might know that we are not alone, and that we will know we are loved. Jesus completely identified himself with us.

This past Sunday we celebrated one of my favorite times in the liturgical year. It was "Baptism of the Lord Sunday." We read the story of the baptism of Jesus by John, and saw another example of Jesus identifying himself with us. Jesus' baptism was an act of love for each one of us.

Like Jesus, his friends identified with him. They walked in his shoes. They showed him that he was not alone.

That is what the sacrament of Baptism is all about. It is about making love real.

As we continue on this journey of a New Year, may you know the real presence of Christ in your life.

The hard times of winter have set in and there is a desperate need for some "comfort items".


DISCIPLE class is holding a drive for the following most requested items:



PAPER CRANES ARE COMING TO HOPE CIRCLE IN JANUARY


Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes is a <u>non-fiction children's book</u> published in 1977.

Do you know the story of Sadako and the 1000 paper cranes? Sadako was a real life girl from Japan. She died in 1955 when she was 12 years old. She was in Hiroshima when the US dropped an atom bomb. Ten years later she died as a result of radiation. Her courage made her a heroine to children in Japan.

Sadako began making origami cranes when she was living her last days in a nursing home. She had a goal of making 1000. In Japan--- paper cranes are a symbol of peace and happiness and prosperity (and the legend says 1000 paper cranes will give you 1000 years.)

For our January program on January 13, 2014, we will review the book and then our own Lou Lindsey will teach us how to make origami paper cranes. I hope we can each make two---one to give away and one to keep.
