The first in-service Sunday of this year is right around the corner! This is a time during the end of the worship services that you, the congregation, is involved in "doing worship" through various hands-on mission projects.

We will be packing boxes on Sunday, March 1 to benefit Big Creek Mission in eastern Kentucky. Our youth will be delivering these boxes during Spring Break when they go to Big Creek for their Mission trip.

Big Creek Mission is located near Bear Branch, Kentucky. Their mission is designed to serve the needs of the people in Appalachia (one of the neediest areas of the country).

Opportunities for ministry may be in one of these three areas:

construction, community, or children. Construction normally involves assisting in renovation of homes of those in need. Community mission work these groups will contain between 8 and 15 students. There will also be evening worship services and devotion time for participants.

In-Service Sunday March 1st!

involves assisting in community outreaches, working with local agencies and ministries to spread the gospel. Mission work in the children's area can involve leading camps or local children's programs. Our youth have unanimously chosen to help in the children's area for the week!

Youth and adult sponsors will stay at Big Creek Mission center, a 24,000 square foot "retired" school building. Workgroups are led by one of the staff members. Normally The In-service Sunday team is asking that each of us bring either one roll of paper towels or one roll of toilet paper on Sunday, March 1 to be included in the packing boxes.

Remember, on March 1st we will end both services a bit early so that we can "do worship" by participating in this project. Our In-Service Sunday team will have everything prepared for us to make a difference in the lives of those served by Big Creek Missions!

Díd You Know . . .

- ...New Haven invites children with special needs and their siblings to come monthly for some fun time away from home
- ...There is time for games both group and individual; creative artwork; music including singing, playing instruments, and movement; delicious snacks; and having a meal that each child brings with them
- ...Respite Care is from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. the second Saturday of each month in the gymnasium
- ...We currently serve six families and normally have eight children in attendance
- ...There is a participant's application process to make sure that New Haven has enough caregivers per special needs child
- ...Our volunteers normally come in shifts (this can be scheduled in hour increments up to the total four hours)
- ...No special skill set is required of the volunteers just love on the children
- ...Total volunteer time each year is approximately 288 hours for this ministry (normally six volunteers per month)
- ... An estimated \$300 is spent on snacks and supplies that is not part of the operating budget



Dear Missy,



Tell me more about "In-Service" Sunday – how are projects picked, what's the purpose, etc? Also wanted to know what we plan to do for the Day Center for the Homeless, aren't we serving meals anymore?

Dear Inquiring,

You've come to the right place to get your questions answered on both these mission-focused projects.

1) **In-Service Sunday**: Periodically, the entire congregation is involved in "doing worship" through hands-on projects right at the end of each worship service. A sub-team of the Mission Committee led by Jennifer Lawrence and Nicole Grafton, determines the needs of various entities or groups. This sub-team determines which ones they feel the church can meet, then an in-service date is set and the sub-team members get to work purchasing items and organizing for the Sunday event. There is a lot of behind the scenes work to make the packaging run smoothly. The team sets up and prepares items before the event and then cleans up and delivers the items after the event has occurred. Some of the past projects benefited Bunche School (snacks during Spring Break); Annual Conference Flood Bucket Collection (items needed during disaster); Carnegie Elementary (teacher appreciation gifts); and Bryce House (coats and toiletries with dopp kit). Each year different missions are selected.

The next in-service Sunday is set for March 1 to benefit Big Creek Mission in Kentucky. Yes, this is where our youth are going on Spring Break. You can help by bringing a roll of toilet paper or a roll of paper towels on that day to add to items being packed. Come and join in on doing worship!

2) **Housewarming Boxes**: In past years, New Haven has provided meals at the Day Center for the Homeless as an outreach mission to the homeless community in Tulsa. A sign up sheet is in the hallway to determine interest in continuing to provide meals. Also, the Day Center has expressed a need for material items for those transitioning to permanent housing. Monthly, they have approximately ten people move to permanent housing. They provide them with a housewarming box. The box is filled with items, such as dishtowels, potholders, a twin sheet set, blanket, kitchen utensils, cleaning supplies, pots and pans. Total cost is approximately \$85 - \$95 to fill a box (if items are mainly purchased from the "Dollar" stores).

If you, a Sunday school class, or other group / organization would like to become involved and make a difference in people's lives, then sign up to fill a box. Empty cardboard boxes will be given to those signing up. Boxes can be returned to the church for delivery. We will add a note of blessing and well wishes from New Haven United Methodist Church before delivering the box back to the Day Center.

1: To Dissolve the Tulsa District Corporation

The first will be the last District Conference of the Tulsa District. It will be held Sunday February 22, 2015, 2:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary of Boston Avenue UMC. This District Conference will conclude the business of Tulsa District and give the Trustees permission to dissolve the Tulsa District Corporation.

#2: First District Conference of the Council Oak District

The second will be a joint Pre Conference Meeting and the first District Conference of the new Council Oak District. It will be held Sunday afternoon May 3, 2015 in Thomas Hall at Tulsa First UMC. In this Conference we will celebrate the beginning of a new District, elect officers, and establish a budget. We are still working on the timing of the afternoon events.

Members of the District Conference include: all clergy (elders, deacons, provisional members, associate members, retired, supernumerary, and local pastors); deaconesses and home missioners; diaconal ministers, the lay leaders from each local church; the presidents of United Methodist Women and United Methodist Men from each church: the district trustees; The District Lay Leader and any associate District Lay Leaders; the lay members of the Annual Conference from each charge: the district president of United Methodist Women, United Methodist Men, and Youth Ministries Council; the district representatives to the Conference Council on Youth Ministries; the district representative to the Conference Department of Congregational Development; and the chairperson of the district Finance Committee.
