

On August 28th, 1963, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. gave a speech that reverberates down through the course of history to this day. In that speech he shared a vision of a world, not

to this day. In that speech he shared a vision of a world, not as it was, but as he hoped it would be. It was a vision rooted in the words of our nation's forefathers when they expressed, "We hold these truths to be self evident, that all men are created equal." Even in those early days in 1776 when our nation was struggling to throw off the chains of oppression and empire, this was a vision not a statement of reality. Dr. King went on to expand that vision in his speech to include values of justice, freedom, racial equality, and even Biblical images of the coming Kingdom of God.





# Help Carnegie Elementary "Rise to Excellence"

Our church has a long-standing relationship with Carnegie Elementary. We grew up together! New Haven's first worship services were held in 1957 just down the street in a pre-fab building on the land where Carnegie would be built in 1958. This relationship has continued throughout the years. We have committed to being their **Partner in Education** (PIE) to help them fulfill their mission to "Rise to Excellence". This partnership has the potential to have a great impact on both Carnegie and New Haven. Their principal, Krista Blanche, is very excited to see our partnership grow and we have identified several ways to do that. We are thrilled that most of these involve being in relationship with the staff, children and families! Please consider helping with these immediate needs:



**<u>Reading mentors</u>**-devote an hour or more on a regular basis listening to children who need extra practice reading (like we do for Project Transformation!)

<u>Testing proctors</u>-be present in classrooms during state testing (April); requires a short online training which the school will provide. Our children will be making encouragement banners for the school's hallways. We will also ask our congregation to help write encouraging notes for the students.

**General volunteers**-help where needed (classrooms, lunchroom, etc.)

**STEAM/Art Night** (late March) Families participate in pre-planned STEAM activities (science, technology, engineering, art, and math); we will help set up, clean up, and assist with activities so parents are free to be with their children.

<u>Carnegie Giving Tree</u>-located at the new Partners In Education (PIE) space located outside the sanctuary. The school is in need of a variety of items from time to time. Pick an item from the tree, bring it back and drop it in the PIE box.

**Staff Birthday Recognition**-join our pie making (or buying) team! Each staff member will receive a birthday card (made by our children) and a pie from their **P**artners **I**n **E**ducation (PIE)-get it!

# Crosses of Love

Anyone who is not familiar with "Crosses of Love," it its a Dutch "Tradition adopted by New Haven 35 years ago.

On Palm Sunday in different parts of the Netherlands families gather together in parks or at their homes to make wooden crosses of different sizes, 1 to 3 feet, after putting them together, they are decorated with ribbons, silk flowers, fruit and some Easter candy . The purpose of the cross of love is to share Jesus who died on the cross for us with others.

Through the years New Haven has shared this tradition with over 8000 people in the mission's, church ministries and community outreach in Tulsa and state wide. Last year we made and shared small stained glass "Crosses of Love" led by our artists Dick Garwood and Regina LaGrone. This year Brother Dick will create the cross and we as Sisters and Brothers will help create the wrapping to put the cross in. Led by our Artistic Regina.
