From a recent sermon by Danny Hall on Sunday, August 30. Danny's sermon was about searching and struggling. The text from Genesis 32 tells about Jacob wrestling with God. Who was the "man" Jacob struggled with? Was Jacob wrestling with God or was he wrestling with himself, his past.

Scholars tell us that the vagueness of this story in Genesis 32 is most likely one of the ways that the narrator protects the mystery of God's involvement with us as human beings. The Christian life is about trusting God and staying connected with God---holding onto God and asking God for a blessing. I think we often feel like Jacob. We are not sure who or what we are running from. Who or what we are wrestling? Join on Danny Sunday Mornings at 10:00 am on Zoom and let's continue to wrestle with God!

Here is an excerpt from the poem "Jacob" by Pastor Nicky Blackford, shared by his widow, Linda Blackford.

Your name is Isra-el: One who struggles with God. Give it up Jacob. Be who you have always been. A child of God, loved

by Him. Arise from all your dreams, Celebrate your new name, Israel. And never doubt again."


Thank you

Mountain of Food

New Haven has been doing the Mountain of Food every fall for nearly 2 decades. This food drive has helped the hungry through the United Methodist sponsored urban ministry, Restore Hope. Our Mountain has been copied by a number of other congregations in the metro area. As we began the planning we asked the basic question: "What do you need?

Of course, this year is unusual in many respects. As the Oklahoma Conference changes the way we support our various ministries, Restore Hope is receiving less funding for operating costs; forcing them to rely on their own fundraising.

With the pandemic, the community is faced with unprecedented demand for housing assistance. Early in the pandemic the demand for food assistance actually decreased from previous years as the federal support for expanded SNAP (food stamps) and unemployment benefits filled the gap.

Entering the final quarter of the year, Restore Hope is seeing a number of changes. Large grants have come in for housing - to help those facing evictions - as the federal funds for increased SNAP and unemployment benefits expire. Demand for food is once again rising, and Restore Hope faces the challenge of funding the staff necessary to distribute not only the housing grants, but also to acquire and distribute food.

The Mountain of Food has always been a way to support the biggest need of Restore Hope. This year we have to recognize that their need is changing. They need unrestricted dollars to support their staff as well as funds to purchase food, (There are no matching funds this year, as the big grants came in for the housing assistance to prevent homelessness.)

Here are some relevant facts:

1 in 3 children in Tulsa County will go to bed hungry due to the pandemic. (Food Bank) 1 in 10 seniors in Tulsa County is food insecure. (Food Bank) Unemployment is rising locally with recent announcements. (Tulsa World) Families facing eviction from their housing are also facing a food shortage; the two go hand in hand. (Restore Hope)

This year let's support Restore Hope as enthusiastically as always. Our Restore Hope - Mountain of Food drive is officially underway. Please write your checks, or mark your contributions in a special envelope. You can put Mountain of Food on the memo line to buy canned goods, cereal, pasta or peanut butter as always. If you put Restore Hope on the memo line your support will go to Restore Hope as unrestricted giving and they can use it to meet their greatest need. If you give electronically, you can go to the website and on the right side of the home page you will see "on-line giving" click on that and follow the instructions to give to Restore Hope.

Our goal is to exceed last year's giving and reach \$8,500. This is ambitious given the pandemic. But New Haven has always risen the challenge and Restore Hope programs are dear to all of us. Please watch for email updates and social media for the latest news. Our drive will conclude on November 1.
