Robert Lowry was the composer; and among his other most famous gospel compositions were: "Nothing but the Blood of Jesus" and "Shall We Gather at the River." He also composed the music for other's texts, such as "Marching to Zion", a camp meeting version of Isaac Watts' text, "Come, We that Love the Lord," and "Need," and the music for Annie Hawks' hymn, "I Need Thee Every Hour."

PROJECT TRANSFORMATION

The Three C's 3 Problems. 1 Solution.

Based on a model founded in 1998 in Dallas, Texas, Project Transformation Oklahoma launched in 2002 to address three unique challenges with one program: 1) how to meet the academic, physical, social-emotional, and spiritual needs of children from low-income communities, 2) how to provide meaningful ways for college-age young adults to explore ministry opportunities and develop as young principled leaders for the church and the world; and 3) how to help revitalize churches in undeserved communities.

Children – College students – Churches. This is a win-win-win formula, but relationships are at the heart of everything we do. It is through relationships that lives are transformed.

Our mission is to engage young adults in purposeful leadership and ministry, support undeserved children and families, and connect churches to communities in need.

Project Transformation's collaborative model of ministry harnesses the creative energy and leadership of college age young adults, who live in intentional Christian community, and lead summer programs for children in various undeserved neighborhoods. Each week, interns meet with church and nonprofit leaders to explore various ministry-related vocations and spend time discerning their vocational call to life-long service. The programs are held at United Methodist churches located in the heart of low-income neighborhoods, thereby helping those churches connect in meaningful ways with their communities. Dozens of other churches and organizations throughout Oklahoma partner together to support this work, investing in these young lives with their time and resources.

Stella: Tall Grass Prairie opened in 1989 with 300 bison and now keeps a herd of 2,000. Around 300 new babies are born each Spring. A section of land is burned to make room for new grasses every three years. It's part of a Nature Preserve Program and is privately funded. Some of the rangers own land & homes within the Preserve. You drive on 2 lane, winding roads through small, scenic Oklahoma towns. The group enjoyed Bad Brad's Bar-b-g for lunch......yummy!
