Dan Clark in his book, *Puppies for Sale and other Inspirational Tales*, writes:

"Robert Redford is a man who believes in taking risks. Someone asked Redford about the trappings of fame that go along with being a movie star.

Redford replied, "I don't have any illusions of how fleeting fame might be. I constantly remind myself that I only have a few years on earth to say some things. The important thing is to take risks in getting those things said. If

you quit taking risks you're liable to lose everything you've worked for."

Again and again, people at the top of their professions are forced to take risks in order to stay there. A researcher named Charles Garfield noticed that many peak performers follow a formula for success.

They ask themselves, "Can I survive if the risk I am about to take doesn't work out? Will I be able to go on if I fail?" If the answer is yes—that they could survive the worst possible consequences— then they take the risk. Do they fail? Of course they do sometimes, but they know they will be okay, even if they falter.

Self-talk is about creating the right questions. Only when we ask the correct questions can we get the correct answers and solutions, which are the decision-making tools necessary for taking calculated risks.

To be successful at whatever we do, we have to take chances. Sure, they scar us. They take us out of our comfort zones. But with positive self-talk we can go for it! The people who rise to the top— the cream of the crop—talk the talk, then take the risks and walk the walk to success and achievement.

As we have visited together during these past few weeks, we've been engaged in "self-talk." We have been asking questions designed to get us thinking about how we become successful as disciples of Jesus Christ. The next phase will soon begin as we compile your responses and identify the common concerns and strengths we share. We will then begin to pray about the direction we are being led by God, and begin to make a plan of how we can get there.

Will there be risk? Yes! Will it be scary at times? Yes! I believe, however, the goal is worth the risk. Jesus came to the sea of Galilee and said, "Come, I will make you fish for people." Immediately they dropped their nets, left their boats, and followed him. Are we willing to follow Christ wherever he leads?

Are we going to the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma any time soon? It was such fun last time our church family participated.

Dear Looking,

The Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma (Food Bank) is the largest private hunger-relief organization in eastern Oklahoma. They have two locations – one in Tulsa and the other in McAlester. The Food Bank provides food and other donated goods to 450 Partner Programs in 24 counties of eastern Oklahoma. These programs include emergency food pantries, soup kitchens, emergency shelters, after-school programs and senior citizen centers. They provide more than 475,000 meals each week to people struggling with hunger. During fiscal year 2017, the Food Bank distributed more than 24.7 million pounds of food, 31 percent of which was fresh produce.

The **mission** of the Food Bank is to feed the hungry of eastern Oklahoma through a network of Partner Programs and to engage communities in ending hunger. Their **vision** is food security, with dignity, for all eastern Oklahomans.

On Tuesday, September 5, you will have an opportunity to work at the Tulsa Food Bank facility located in Tulsa (1304 N. Kenosha Avenue). The Tulsa warehouse is a 78,000 sq. ft. facility that can store up to three million pounds of food at any one time. This warehouse has state-of-the-art coolers and freezers with 288 freezer and 288 refrigerator pallet spaces. It is also equipped with a 2,200 sq. ft. culinary center where thousands of pounds of perishable food are processed into frozen meals for later distribution.

Plan to meet at the church parking lot and leave by 5:20 pm. We will load up the mini-bus and go to the Food Bank facility and work from 6 pm to 8 pm. then return by 8:30 pm. Youth age 11 and older are welcome to come and join in.
