Your youth have returned from Camp Egan! And what an experience it was to in God's presence in what I always call one of the "thinnest" places on earth. Josh Pulver (Camp Egan's Director) had several big projects for us during our stay, and we were able to get most of the work done which he said to me over and over how much of a blessing it was to have the volunteers to help. Without question for me one of the most rewarding experiences was watching the Prayer Labyrinth come together. The one that Egan had for many years washed away in recent flooding the Camp experienced back in 2015, and Josh simply hasn't had the manpower or the time to get it rebuilt. Well we got it built, and along the way got to share in some fellowship time together, and with youth groups from St. Stephen's UMC (Norman), and Cushing UMC who were there at camp during the first half and second half of our stay respectively. It was extremely moving to see several days' worth of hard labor turn into a place at camp that will create powerful opportunities for God to touch visitors lives as they walk the labyrinth. We ourselves to an opportunity before we left to spend some quiet time walking it, and a powerful experience would be an understatement for sure!

During our stay we cleared the Creekside cabin from leaves underneath it's porch and decking and burned those off. Shout out to Hannah, Julian, and Tim who had no worries crawling underneath to get the piles out to the rest of us to gather. Egan was hosting a women's retreat at the same time as us as well, and we had got to help Josh clear out all of the chairs from this conference of 110 women from Arkansas when they left. Our last project we worked on was clearing brush from one of the wooded areas below "Cross Mountain" where the low level portion of an eventual complete ropes course was to begin being installed in the coming weeks.

Without a doubt we stayed busy and worked hard, but we also had a LOT of fun and made some fantastic memories! From s'mores, to games, to "make-up training", to learning more about ourselves, respect for others, and servanthood it was 5 days I won't soon forget. We'd like to thank you for all of your prayers during our trip, and when you have the chance please ask any of the youth that went (or Stacey Schifferdecker – THANK YOU STACEY) about their memories, and what they really enjoyed about the experience. I definitely look forward to working, worshipping, and fellowshipping in mission with this group again someday soon!!

What is a Lay Servant?

A Certified Lay Servant (CLS) is a trained volunteer who serves the church and community in a wide variety of ministries. They offer their gifts, both at the local church and beyond, in areas of caring, leading, and communicating. Examples are worship leadership, preaching, teaching, visitation, community volunteer, grief support, prison or nursing home ministries, food or clothing banks, committee/project leaders, etc. There are virtually no limits to the serving possibilities! To become a CLS, you must complete the Basic Course and an Advanced Course. But, the Lay Servant Ministries educate, too! Anyone can take the courses whether you want to become a Lay Servant or not! Contact your pastor or Lay Leader for information.
