It is great to be back at New Haven United Methodist Church after a couple of weeks of vacation. I missed my daily conversations and engagement with all of you in your lives. However, it was also good to be able to get away, do some personal reflection, and spend some time in spiritual renewal.

As many of you know, I went to northern Minnesota to the

Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness, 1.5 million acres of protected trees, lakes, and wildlife. I am always in awe of God's creation when I visit this place. I am reminded of how small my life and troubles really are, and how magnificent God and His creation really is. I try to go to the wilderness each year as a way of retreating from the distractions of this world — news, internet and Facebook, cell phones, etc. This gives me an opportunity to reset my inner compass on God's plan for my life, as well as to experience the peace that comes with communing with God.

It has been three years since I have been able to go, because of several unexpected life occurrences. I found that I really needed this experience. I had noticed that my patience was growing thin, my mind was cluttered, and my focus was a bit frayed. During my time in the wilderness I was reminded of God's amazing ability to renew all of creation and me along with it.

Five years ago a terrible fire swept through some of my favorite lakes east of Ely, Minnesota. The fire destroyed camp sites, beautiful old trees, and damaged wildlife in the area. I visited the area directly after the fire and witnessed the devastation. This past week I returned, five years later, and signs of God's healing was everywhere. Yes, there were still scars, tall dead sticks of trees that had been killed by the fire. However, there was new life everywhere. Wild flowers growing in areas that were formerly shaded by trees, and thousands of new pines and birch trees were poking their heads up about 5-8 feet above the ground. Chipmunks, squirrels, birds and Bald Eagles were everywhere. The earth is healing, and along with that God has begun healing my soul as well. My prayer for you this week is that you will see God's promise of new creation around you and allow Him to work in you as well.

What is the Walk to Emmaus?

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The program's approach seriously considers the model of Christ's servanthood and encourages Christ's disciples to act in ways appropriate to being "a servant of all."

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship and daily celebration of Holy Communion. The "Emmaus community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, support the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Emmaus Walk typically begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. Men and women attend separate weekends.

The next men's event will be Thursday, October 26 through Sunday, October 29. The next women's event will be Thursday, November 9 through Sunday, November 12. Both events are being held at Harvard Avenue Christian Church, 5502 S. Harvard Ave. in Tulsa.
