Spiritual Practices Class Labyrinth Walk

Sunday, March 30 was our third class in a five week series entitled "Ancient Spiritual Practices Made Relevant for Today". Jone Friesen helped to facilitate the walk for us in the gym during the morning. We practiced the ancient art of meditation walking. The Adult Education Council had borrowed a 36 foot portable labyrinth from St. John's Episcopal Church. It was a Chartres medieval replica, 11-circuit canvas designed after the labyrinth found in the Chartres Cathedral near Paris, France (shown below).



The walk was done in three stages:

- 1. The first stage of the walk (until you reach the center) is shedding – a releasing, a letting go of the details of your life. This stage was to quiet the mind.
- 2. The next stage of the walk (when you reach the center) is illumination – a place of meditation and prayer. Here we were able to sit, stand or kneel. We were allowed to take as much time as was needed then we simply followed the path back out.
- 3. The final stage is of union, which is joining with the Divine, your Higher Power, or the healing forces at work in the world. There was a space set aside after the walk for prayer, meditation, and journaling.

Next Sunday, April 6 we will practice breath prayers. Prayers that are as easy to pray as it is to breathe. Hope you will join us as we experience and share together.


