Kelly Clark - Snowboarding (Halfpipe): She is a four-time Olympian and two-time medalist in the women's snowboarding event.

Lolo Jones - Bobsled: One of the most visible athletes on the U.S. team, Lolo is known almost as much for her faith, as she is for her athletic talent and drive.

David Wise - Freeskiing (Halfpipe): Now 23, he is ranked first in the world and is a gold medal favorite. He and his wife run the youth group at their church, and someday hopes to become a full-time pastor.

Anne Schleper - Hockey: Schleper leads a Bible study at Team USA training camps.

Elana Meyers - Bobsled: Elana is a favorite to take home a gold or silver in Sochi. She says, "One of the big reasons I was put in bobsled is to help people not only reach their goals, but come to Christ."

Our attention and prayers are with these athletes this week, as we marvel at their passion for the Olympic sports. May we, too, show our passion for our God and remember to pause, and give thanks for all He is doing in our lives!
