A REMINDER ABOUT OUR CHRISTMAS BAGS FOR THE STUDENTS AT REMINGTON SCHOOL.

We are committed to making a "Christmas Bag" for the 300 students who attend Remington School here in Tulsa. This is the Children's area Christmas project which we are doing instead of the Christmas Boxes which we had done for several years. This year we decided to bless some children right here in our home town instead of shipping gifts overseas. The shipping cost has gone up every year and now nearly doubles the cost of the boxes we send.

Remington is a community school which serves 300 students and their families.

- Most of its 300 students go home to the Cherry Hill trailer park and Section 8-funded Parkview apartments.
- 80-95% of the students use the bus.
- Almost all 300 students are on a free or reducedlunch program.
- Remington is located at the end of a dead-end street, which forces a sense of community because its community partners aren't in the immediate vicinity. The school's small student population also strengthens this community sense. Says Community School Coordinator Heather Palmer, "We're all like one big family here." An array of programs, services, and opportunities at the school are designed to promote this feeling.

***Please remember that because we hope to make the gifts for these children look very similar, we are requesting monetary funds this year instead of asking you to go out and purchase different items. Easier for you, too! Thank you so much for your donations!!!
