Remington is a community school which serves 300 students and their families.

- Most of its 300 students go home to the Cherry Hill trailer park and Section 8-funded Parkview apartments.
- 80-95% of the students use the bus.
- Almost all 300 students are on a free or reducedlunch program.
- Remington is located at the end of a dead-end street, which forces a sense of community because its community partners aren't in the immediate vicinity. The school's small student population also strengthens this community sense. Says Community School Coordinator Heather Palmer, "We're all like one big family here." An array of programs, services, and opportunities at the school are designed to promote this feeling.














TICKETS FOR HAPPY CHILDREN'S HOME AVAILABLE THIS SUNDAY

The gala evening with dinner, entertainment and fine arts celebrating the Happy Children's Home on Friday, October 24th is less than a month away! You can purchase your ticket at church this coming Sunday. It's a district-wide benefit. Tickets are \$40 per person. You can purchase either individual tickets for open seating or tickets for a table of eight.

News is just in that one of Paul Mabrey's famous former students will come to sing with his teacher and mentor that night, and perform some solos as well! Kingsley Leggs was a budding star at TCC under Paul's direction, and has since wowed audiences on Broadway in "Sister Act," "The Color Purple," and "Miss Saigon." He toured with Broadway's cast of "Sister Act," "Ragtime," Miss Saigon," and "It Ain't Nothing but the Blues." His regional performances are numerous, appearing in major theatre houses in Washington D.C., NYC, Denver, Dallas, Baltimore, Milwaukee, St. Louis and more. He has a thriving television career as well, with performances in "City of Angels," "One Life to Live," and "Law and Order SVU."

We are so pleased that Pamela Prescott has also joined the line up of musicians to entertain! Pamela is assisting at New Haven UMC with special music, directing children and adult choirs, and helping to lead the music for services. She holds her Associates in Music degree from Tulsa Community College, and will graduate from the University of Tulsa next year. She also teaches currently at Brook Fine Arts, and has taught private music lessons independently. Pamela and her husband Jeff have four boys whose ages range from 6 to 15. Pamela began caring for her ill grandparents when she was a senior in high school and her family commitments postponed her formal music education. We are fortunate to be the beneficiaries of her sharing and caring outlook which has blessed our church and will be appreciated by the attendees of the Happy Children's Home of China benefit.

The "It's All About the Children" evening will feature two children. Anna Teoh, a child adopted from China, will play the piano. The program will end with a New Haven UMC child, Gracelyn Logston, reading a letter from a child at the Happy Children's Home. Our New Haven Youth will serve the meal, along with other District youth.

The painting of the home by Adriaan Duiveman's uncle from Maine has arrived in Tulsa and is being framed in preparation for its auction that evening. The watercolorist himself and his wife are flying in to attend this special event.

Rev. Shannon Davis will be our expert master of ceremonies. While a pastor at New Haven UMC, he chaired the Happy Children's Home Committee and attended the Dedication of the home in 2006. We will honor him and others who were instrumental in the establishment of this district mission project in the early years. Jan Davis will join her husband in a violin and piano duet! The co-founder, Joellyn Brown, is coming from Georgia, and the other co-founder, Mrs. Peter Lee, will be represented by her children and grandchildren.

Next In-Service Sunday - November 9th

The next in-service Sunday will benefit the veterans living at Bryce House at 12th and Baltimore in Tulsa. Bryce House is a specialized transitional living facility for homeless veterans who've undergone treatment for drug or alcohol addiction. Veterans can live at Bryce House for up to two years as they continue rehabilitation and progress toward independence.

On Sunday, November 9th, we will be packing items after both the 8:45 and 11 o'clock services for the thirty-one occupants at Bryce House. We will be released a few minutes early from Worship. This allows plenty of time to pack the designated items and provides an opportunity to "do worship". Please join us in worshipping God through this in-service ministry!

In addition, we are asking that if you have a gently used (or new) men's coat (any size) that you bring it to the church. The veterans can use a coat for the upcoming colder weather. The Committee will add hats and gloves to your coat donation. We will have clothes racks in the hallway to hang the men's coats. Everyone will be packing dopp kits with toiletries and various other items. Thank you for caring for others in need.
