Often on a Sunday morning, I hear these questions:

Why are there different colors in the Sanctuary; why do you change the color of the stole on your clergy robe?

The linens and cloth used on our altar, pulpit and lectern are called "paraments". The colors of the paraments reflect the traditional colors of the seasons of the Christian year.

Don Gregory is our "Altar Master", who makes sure the paraments are changed as the seasons of the Christian year change. Thank you, Don! Often the paraments are embellished with specific symbols appropriate to the Christian season.

The Christian year has two cycles: the Christmas Cycle

Why Different Color Altar Cloths and Stoles?

(Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter Cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost). In each cycle are a preparatory season symbolized by the color purple (or blue) and a festival season symbolized by the color white. After each cycle there is an ordinary time of growth symbolized the color green. This makes a sequence of seasons using purple (or blue), white, and green (in that order) twice each year.

At New Haven UMC, blue is used during the Advent season to symbolize hope. Purple (representing royalty and penitence), is used during the season of Lent. White and gold are used at Christmas and Easter to symbolize joy. White is also displayed the first Sunday of every month to denote Communion Sunday.

Red (my favorite color for our Sanctuary) symbolizes the color of fire representing the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. Red is also used for ordinations, church anniversaries and civil observances such as Memorial Day and Thanksgiving. Green represents growth and is used during Ordinary Time (the season after Epiphany and after Pentecost.)

When you come to church this next Sunday, stop and look around. Can you tell which liturgical season is represented? If you need a little help with this...look for the name of the liturgical color in the upper right corner of the worship bulletin!
