According to the dictionary, "Advent is the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event." In the Christian faith, Advent is the first season of the Christian church year leading up to Christmas and including the previous four Sundays. For Christians, advent is a time of preparation and waiting for the arrival of Jesus, whether it is the first coming (birth) of the Christ Child, or the expected return of Jesus or second coming.

For me, Advent is meaningless unless we understand that it is the identity of Jesus that gives this event meaning. Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah of God, and the savior of the world!

This the key theological piece that makes Advent important. Without this understanding, the birth of Jesus would have been no different than any other baby born into an insignificant poor family. And yet, when this child was born and wrapped in bands of cloth and laid on some hay in a barn, the angels of heaven sang! They sang Glory to God in the heaven and on earth, peace to all of humanity! They appeared to some smelly old shepherds in the middle of the night, and the shepherds, over coming their fear, went forth to find this child who was to be the savior of the world.

More than two millennium later we still look for this child. On the first Sunday of Advent, we light a candle as a symbol of expectation. The expectation that the light sent from God will shine in the darkness to show us the way to salvation! O come, O come, Emmanuel!

Next Sunday we visit Luke's home and then we will stop at John's place. There is one more stop before we return to spend Christmas in our own homes.


