





The Christian life is about trusting God and staying connected with God---holding onto God and asking God for a blessing. I think we often feel like Jacob. Here is an excerpt from the poem "Jacob" by Pastor Nicky Blackford, shared by his widow, Linda Blackford.

Your name is Isra-el: One who struggles with God. Give it up Jacob. Be who you have always been. A child of God, loved by Him. Arise from all your dreams, Celebrate your new name, Israel.
